

EQUIPMENT SAFETY



Before operating any type of machinery, always refer to the manufacturer's original operating manual to ensure proper safety practices of your specific equipment. Additional precautions may be necessary depending on the equipment.

Know the rules. Most job sites have rules governing equipment use and maintenance. Before you start work at a new location, check with your supervisor or safety coordinator. Ask about the rules you will be expected to obey.

KNOW THE IMPORTANCE OF SIGNAL WORDS

A DANGER

DANGER indicates a hazardous situation that, if not avoided, will result in death or serious injury.

WARNING

WARNING indicates a hazardous situation that, if not avoided, could result in death or serious injury.

A CAUTION

CAUTION indicates a hazardous situation that, if not avoided, may result in minor or moderate injury.

NOTICE

NOTICE is used to address practices not related to physical injury.
